

The Global AI Race: Nations, Chips, and Standards

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AI capability is now treated as national power, alongside energy and weapons. The competition runs on four inputs — chips, energy, data, and talent — and on a quieter contest over who writes the rules the rest of the world imports. You don't need a security clearance to read the board; you need the map of the pieces.

THE FOUR RESOURCES

» Compute

Advanced accelerators come from a supply chain with a handful of chokepoints; export controls on them are the sharpest tool in play.

» Energy

Training and serving frontier models demands city-scale power; grid capacity is becoming AI policy.

» Data

Language coverage, scientific corpora, and domestic platform data shape what models can learn — and whose worldview they encode.

» Talent

A small global pool of frontier researchers; visa policy is quietly AI policy too.

THREE REGULATORY GRAVITIES

Broadly: a comprehensive-rules bloc (led by the EU's risk-based AI Act), an innovation-first bloc favoring sector-by-sector and voluntary frameworks (the U.S. pattern), and state-directed models that pair aggressive deployment with content control. Multinationals typically build to the strictest applicable standard, which is how one region's rules become de facto global defaults — the “Brussels effect.”

WHY A BUSINESS SHOULD CARE

Chip controls ripple into cloud prices and model availability. Data-residency rules decide where your AI workloads may run. Standards choices determine what documentation your vendors must hand you. Watching the geopolitics is not spectating — it is supply-chain planning.
